Dear Town of Kill Devil Hills Board of Commissioners,

The Community Care Clinic of Dare (CCCD) is the only integrated medical-dental-mental health-pharmacy healthcare facility dedicated to serving adults without affordable health insurance who live/work in Dare County.

This fiscal year, CCCD's dental clinic provided \$498,356 worth of dental care to qualified individuals at a reduced cost, adjusting off \$215,633 of patient costs. CCCD's pharmacy provided \$1,991,414 in prescription medications and \$71,132 of OTC medications for a nominal contribution (e.g., \$5.00 for 30-day Rx). CCCD provided \$983,535 worth of medical services for a nominal annual admin fee (e.g., \$60/year for unlimited medical, lab work, and health education). CCCD diverted over \$7,000,000 from local emergency departments last year.

CCCD is sustained through individual/business donations, county and local government contributions, State grants, foundations, and fundraising events. We are so grateful for your support as our budget has increased with each new service line.

Your contribution to the Community Care Clinic of Dare reduces overall healthcare costs to the community. Providing primary care for acute and chronic conditions alleviates overuse of the Emergency Department and helps prevent poor outcomes. CCCD's ancillary services include cancer screenings, lab work, MRI/CT/X-rays/US, specialist referrals, eye care, and physical therapy. Patients with diabetes receive retinal eye screenings and treatment to prevent vision loss.

CCCD offers Vivitrol, an injectable medication to treat opioid and alcohol use disorder. Vivitrol suppresses the craving for these substances, and paired with counseling, it supports the individual to become completely drug-free.

Our health educators and nurse navigators assess all patients for social determinants of health including food, clothing, shelter, personal safety, transportation, employment, substance use, etc. Closed loop referrals to local resources ensure our patients receive the support they need.

CCCD partners with the Food Bank of the Albemarle to host two food distribution events each month, normally attended by 90+ families, to address food insecurity in Dare County.

We respectfully ask the Town Council to consider increasing its support to \$20,000 this year so we may continue to meet patient medical, dental, prescription, and mental health needs in Kill Devil Hills and Dare County.

I welcome you to come for a visit, a tour, and meet our staff and volunteers.

CCCD met performance outcome measures for patients diagnosed with diabetes/hypertension

- Only 14% of patients diagnosed with diabetes had A1c > 9%
- 71% of patients diagnosed with hypertension have BP < 140/90
